RESOLUTION SUBMITTING QUESTION OF INCREASING LIMIT OF INDEBTEDNESS TO ELECTORS

WHEREAS, proceedings have been heretofore taken by the School Board of Maple Valley Public School District No. 4 of Cass and Barnes Counties, North Dakota (the "School District") for the issuance of general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$14,300,000 for the purpose of providing money to construct an addition to the Tower City school building for classrooms, common areas and gymnasium, to remodel, renovate and equip the Tower City school building, and to otherwise maintain and improve school property; and

WHEREAS, there is a special school election to be held on September 20, 2016, at which time the question of the approval of an initial resolution for the issuance of general obligation school building bonds will be submitted; and

WHEREAS, an increase in the debt limit of the School District is advisable,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. It is deemed advisable to increase the limit of indebtedness of the School District five percent (5%) on the assessed value of taxable property of the School District beyond the five percent (5%) limit of indebtedness fixed by the Constitution.
- 2. The question to increase the debt limit of the School District shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the School District at the time of the special election to be held on September 20, 2016.
- 3. The Business Manager of the School District is hereby directed to give notice of the election by publishing a notice thereof in the official newspaper of the School District once each week for at least two weeks, with the first of such publications at least fifteen (15) days before the election.
- 4. The Business Manager is hereby authorized and directed to cause typed or printed ballots to be prepared for use at the special election, which ballots shall be in substantially the following form:
